How is this movement connected with the U.S. Tribes?

- Canadian Tribes and U.S. Tribes share a similar historical experience involving colonization. And actually, prior to colonization there wasn't a U.S. and Canada Border, the present day political border cuts right through tribes that weren't historically divided in that way.
