## **MISSION:**

**To prepare ALL students to be successful members of our diverse society.**

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### **Start of Fall Semester**

#### **SEPTEMBER 8<sup>TH</sup> 2020:**

- LEVEL 1 - 100% “Distance Learning”
  - With current number of COVID 19 cases in the county and per DIRECTIVE from Okanogan County Health Officer, GCDSB will begin school in the fall on LEVEL 1 - 100% “Remote Learning”. (Appendix A)
  
- First day of school September 8<sup>th</sup>
  - Parent/Student conferences Sept 8, 9, 10 by appointment.
    - Orientation for parents/students on procedures and protocols dealing with Distance Learning platform
  
- Two academic options for all students
  - Remote/In-person learning (Hybrid) or
  - 100% Remote (Semester long)

We have developed two learning options for LRHS students.

- Option 1: Remote/In-person (Hybrid) learning plan has 4 different levels. This plan will be fluid between Remote (Distance learning) to In-Person learning depending on the COVID 19 matrix and Okanogan county Health approval.
  - Goal: 100% in person instruction at school.
    - Level 1 - Remote (distance learning),
    - Level 2 - One day per week in-classroom,
    - Level 3 - Two days per week in-classroom,
    - Level 4 - 100% in-person.
  
- Option 2: 100% Remote learning (Distance learning with teacher support)
  - Goal: Offer an opportunity to meet parents concerns with remote instruction and safety.

These plans take into consideration;

- 1- Parental options for their child.
- 2- County Health directive
- 3- Access equity for ALL students
  - a. Recognizing reliable wi-fi access
- 4- Social Distancing (less than 15 per classroom)
- 5- ALL students have an electronic device
  - a. Purchasing enough Chromebooks for 1-to-1 device
  - b. Distribution of educational materials when distance learning.
- 6- Using “Flash Drives” as the default mode of distribution/communication with student
- 7- Teachers work from their classroom
- 8- At risk students.

# PLANS:

## Option 1: Remote/In-person (Hybrid) learning:

The following plan is based on the concept of students eventually returning to the classroom for their academic learning.

Example plan for Level two:

- Each class/grade level is divided into 4 pods of 5 – 10 students. (meets social distance limit)
- Guarantee 1 day in person w/teacher per week (Equity)
- Pod 1 attends school on Tuesday, Pod 2 attends school on Wednesday, Pod 3 attends school on Thursday, Pod 4 attends school on Friday. At risk students attend an additional day on Monday (if needed).
- School begins at 8:20 and ends at 3:05 (normal school hours)
- Students are transported by bus, parents or walk (parents are encouraged to transport their child)
- GCDS Teachers plan and prepare a 5-day lesson plan given to students via “Flash drive” (grade according to state standards)
- Students will be transported by bus (assistant on each bus to manage student safety protocol)

## Option 2: Remote (On-line) Learning:

100% Remote On-line program – Parents may choose “Raiders online”. This program is an option for parents who are concerned and have reservations about sending their child to school during the pandemic.

### RAIDERS online

Remote On-line program is where students work from home in an on-line curriculum that has been developed by a third party.

- Elementary uses Pending (k – 5<sup>th</sup>)
- Secondary uses Apex Learning (6<sup>th</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup>)

Staff meet weekly with students and families to plan the weeks activities through a learning plan and required hours. (28.5 hours per wk.)

Daily support available from 8:00 am – 3:45pm

**Raiders online is an On-Line Learning Environment with support from staff. Students work through a self-paced flexible online only curriculum. Students who are enrolled in Raiders Online will be interacting with adults rather than their peers.**

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### Attendance/Learning:

- 180 days of student learning
- 1027 hours annually
  - Average about 5.7 hours of learning per day
  - 28.5 hours/week

#### Option 1:

- Students with WiFi check in daily via google classroom
  - Elem. students minimum once per day.
  - Secondary students once per day per class
- Students w/o WiFi will be contacted daily by a “Tutor”
  - Parents need to identify contact number

#### Option 2:

- Attendance will be determined by WAC 392-401A-015 and in collaboration with teacher.
  - See Appendix F

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### Grading:

Teachers will grade according to the State Standards.

- Elem. students are graded on a scale of 4 – 1
- Secondary students are graded on a scale of A – F

## Food Service:

Meals will be served daily. Lunches served will be tracked per USDA procedures and protocols.

- Meals will be served at the school building.
  - Meals will be delivered three days per week (M,W,F) – pending state funding
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## Safety:

- Staff and students shall be required to wear masks (or other approved face covering)
  - All staff, students and community will be required to adhere to established entrance protocol upon entering Lake Roosevelt school buildings. (Appendix B)
  - Staff and students will maintain social distancing of 6ft or more whenever and wherever possible
    - Less than 15 students per classroom
  - Classes will be dismissed in a staggered format (bells will not be used) in order to maintain proper social distancing between classes
    - Teachers will be assigned dismissal times
  - Adequate sanitizer will be supplied to each classroom
  - Restroom procedures to be developed
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## Technology:

- 1 to 1 device: Chromebooks will be available for check-out for all students
- Flash drives (2 Flash Drives per student) will be the means for communication and distribution of materials during remote learning.
- Student orientation and distribution during the first week of school
  - Students and parents will be instructed on the operation and procedure for completing and returning all classwork assigned

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## Transportation:

- Students will be transported on current bus routes.
  - Students will be required to wear masks while riding the bus.
  - Safety protocol will be in effect for all students riding the bus.
    - This includes taking temperatures and addressing the six symptoms
  - Parents are encouraged to transport their child to school.
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## Plan review

This plan will be reevaluated on a monthly basis with implementation of new level quarterly. Movement between levels will be based upon data provided from the county health department as well as the COVID-19 matrix for the area.
